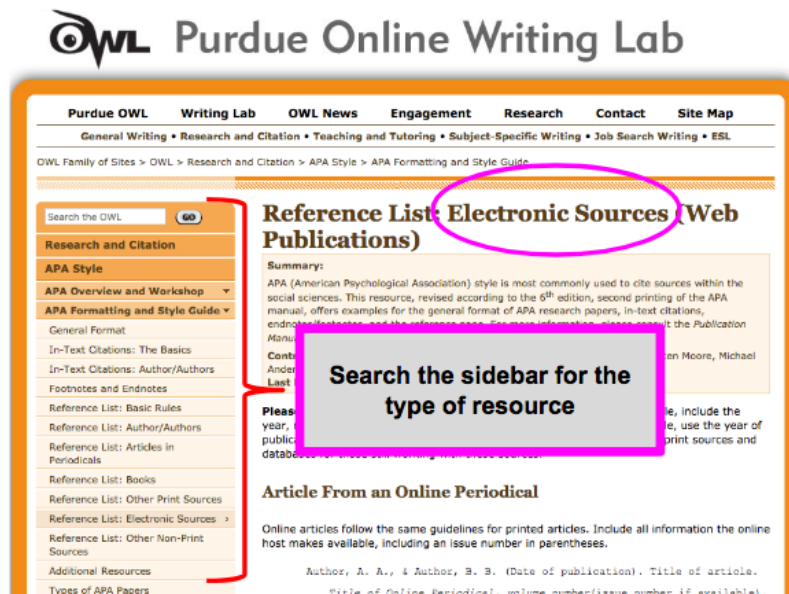
## 1. Google

- Start with a phrase like “How to \_\_\_\_\_” and fill in the blank with your query.
- Use the quick guide as an orienting example. Confirm your citation with Purdue OWL (see instructions below).
